1. INTRODUCTION ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Haripur is the most famous town of District Kangra and it was the capital of Guler Riyasat founded by Raja Hari Chand in 1415 AD. The town is retaining larger number of artefacts and artists in the great historic and cultural heritage of India during middle, pre-colonial and modern era. The river Banner which is popularly known as Banganga in Kangra separates the town from Guler and makes Pong Wetland is a heaven for large number of migratory birds in winters.

The names Nainsukh and Manku are in golden print of the cultural saga of Haripur in the field of hilly paintings. Thus they occupy a dignified place among great Indian painters. Beyond this great soil of Haripur has contributed to the great Indian literary writings in Hindi through the pen of Pt. Chander Dhar Sharma Guleri. He has enriched Hindi literature with his acclaimed literary masterpieces through his writing excellence. Apart from this his great literary creation *Usne Kaha Tha* adapted by Indian cinema in the form of most famous film bearing the same title starring by popular celebrities Sunil Dutt and Nanda which was screened in 1960.

Started in 1994 as a private college by Bharat Education Society and taken over by the H.P. Government on 20.4.2007, the Govt. Degree College, Haripur (Guler) stands today in symbolic shadow of Pt. Shri Chander Dhar Sharma Guleri. This college has its own building which is one of the most beautiful piece of architecture, the college keeps 90 canals land near Mata Dhantoshi Temple. The nearest colleges are Nagrota Surian, Dehra and Dhaliara. This area and its youth richly deserves an Institute offering higher education in Science, Arts and Commerce streams that would cater to the aspirations of the people of this region. The college has got the permission to start BCA classes from the academic session 2019-20. 4. ADMISSION RULES

General Rules:

- 4.1. Admission will be strictly on fulfillment of eligibility conditions.
- 4.2. H.P. university has adopted annual system
- 4.3. Aadhar card number should be written in the admission form. If any applicant has not registered himself/herself for the Aadhar Card, they must contact Dr. Dinesh Kumar Sharma for guidance.
- 4.4. Any gap in academic career of an applicant must be supported by documentary evidence.
- 4.5. Applicants who have passed Prabhakar are not eligible for admission.
- 4.6. Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe candidate seeking fee concession must furnish their status by a first class magistrate.
- 4.7. Candidate coming from Boards other than H.P. Board of School Education must produce Migration Certificate in original.
- 4.8. Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled if he/she furnishes incomplete/wrong/false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will be taken against such a candidate.
- 4.9. Notwithstanding eligibility for admission, the Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of a student has not been up to the mark during the previous year.
- 4.10. Initially, all admission will be provisional and subject to the final approval by H.P. University.
- 4.11. A Student can migrate from one college to another in accordance with the rules laid down by H.P. University. However, such student must obtain approval of the concerned admission committee.
- 4.12. Students placed under compartment in 10+2 class will not be eligible for admission to the B.A./B.Com./B.Sc. Ist Year of three year degree course.

- 4.13. Girl students seeking admission in any class must bring an attested copy of H.P. Bonafide Certificate to avail the fee concession.
- 4.14. Handicapped student seeking fee concession must furnish their status certificate from Medical Board.
- 4.15. The student who have appeared in I, & II Year can take Roll on admission in II & III Year, as per the admission calendar.
- 4.16. The principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission.
- 4.17. Application form must be filled properly, complete in all respects and submitted along with the following documents:
 - (a) **Attested copy of Matric Examination/Date of Birth Certificate**
 - (b) **Attested copies of lower examinations passed**
 - (c) **Original Character Certificate from the institution last attended.**
 - (e) **Three Passport size photographs (to be pasted on Record file, Admission form & Library card)**
 - (e) **Attested copy of H.P. Bona-fide certificate for girls seeking admission to any calss to avail fee concession.**
 - (f) **Passport size photograph of a parent to be pasted on PTA membership from.**
 - (g) **Attested copy of SC/ST/OBC certificate.**
 - (h) **Attested copy of Aadhar Card.**
 - (i) **Two postage stamps of Rs. 6/- each to be pasted on Result card and letter for PTA General House on the address side.**
- 4.18. Rules for admission are subject to change as per H.P.U./Govt. of HP notifications from time to time.

5. UG PROGRAMME

5.1. Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective/minor or skill based courses. The courses can be evaluated following the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marks system. Therefore, it is necessary to introduce uniform grading system in the entire higher education in India. This will benefit the students to move across institutions within India& abroad. The uniform grading system will also enable potential employers in assessing the performance of the candidates. In order to bring uniformity in evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed.

Outline of Choice Based Credit System :

1. **Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Course** : A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a core course.
2. **Elective Course** : Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specialized or advances or supportive to be discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
 - 2.1. **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course** (2 Each for reugarl courses) : Elective courses may be offered from the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study)
 - 2.2. **Dissertation/Project Work** : An elective course of 6 credits, designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a courses on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project work. A Project/Dissertation work be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

2.3. Generic Elective Course (GEC) : An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure to other subjects/disciplines is called a Generic Elective Courses.

P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice-versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

- 3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) / Competency Improvement Courses / Skill Development Courses/Foundation Courses :** The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds : AE Compulsory Course (AECC) and AE Elective Courses (AEEC). “AECC” Courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. They {(i) Environmental Science, (ii) English/MIL communication} are mandatory for all disciplines. AECC courses are value-based and /or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skill, etc.

3.1. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) : Environmental Science, English Communication/MIL Communication.

3.2. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) (Minimum 4) : These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based instruction.

5.2. Eligibility for Admission:

- (a) A pass in the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education of an examination accepted as equivalent there to by the various bodies of the H.P. University.
 - (i) Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc. programme.
 - (ii) Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream/Economics or Maths shall be given preference in admission to B.Com. Programme.
- (b) An applicant must not be more than 23 years (25 years for girls) of age as on 01-07-2025 and must not have been born earlier to 01-07-2002. However in case of overage candidates, the Vice-Chancellor may allow age relaxation up to six months. In case of Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe students, relaxation up to three years is allowed as per rules.
- (c) An applicant failing in all subjects or having a compartment in 10+2 will not be admitted.

6.3 For the Degree:

1. A regular candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in a college affiliated to the H.P. University for a period not less than three academic years (and not more than five academic years) pass the examinations prescribed and fulfilled such conditions as have been prescribed therefor.
2. There shall be no private or other category of students and shall be eligible for degree either through regular mode or through distance education mode.
3. A candidate other than regular candidates shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study International Centre for Distance Education and Open Learning (ICDEOL) H.P. University for a period not less than three academic years (and not more than five academic years), passed the examinations prescribed and fulfilled such conditions as have been prescribed thereof.
4. The minimum passing marks will be 40% aggregate. However 35% each in Internal Assessment and Final Examination will be compulsory. For practical 40% passing marks will be compulsory and if a candidate face to obtain 40% marks in practical will be treated as fail in the subject.
5. A candidate failing in either one or two subject/papers will be given compartment in that subject/paper and will be eligible for promotion to the next class. He/She will appear in the subject/paper in which he/she got the compartment. He/She will have two chances (one have the supplementary stage and one at the annual stage), available to him to clear his/her compartment in subject/paper.
6. He/She will not be awarded the degree until he/she clears all his/her course within five year from the date of his/her admission to a particular course.
7. A candidate failing in three or more subjects/paper will be treated as fail in that year and has to repeat.
8. The successful candidate will be classified on the combined result of the Part-I, II and III examination as fallow.

First Division	:	60% marks or more in the aggregate
Second Division	:	50% marks but less than 60%
Third Division	:	Less than 50%

6.4 Students Coursewise Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and Evaluation

All Courses (Core, Elective and Skills Courses) involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components :-

- (i) **Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA)** accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course; and
 - (ii) **End-Semester Examination (ESE)** Annual Exam. accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that a student gets in a course for Arts and Commerce and 50% for theory and 20% for Practical Science & Geography.
- (i) **Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA)** : This would have the following components :
- (a) **Classroom Attendance** : Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/Tutorials/Practicals. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in End Semester Examination (ESE).
 - * Provided that those having between 75% and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason (s) for absence to the authorized functionaries.
 - * Provided that those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by a Medical certificate from a Government Hospital.
 - * Provided that exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participating in prescribed co-curricular activities (e.g. NSS, NCC, Youth Festivals, Sports, Rovers & Rangers etc.) to the extent of 25% (making the necessary attendance as 50% in these cases). However, the claim for this exemption should be supported by an authenticated certificate from the concerned college authorities.
 - * Provided further that those getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemptions for co-curricular activities, will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below :
 - (b) **Classroom Attendance Incentive** : Those having greater than 75% attendance (for those participating in Co-curricular activities, 25% will be added to percent attendance) will be awarded CCA marks as follows :

*	□ 75% but < 79%	1 Marks
*	□ 80% but < 84%	2 Marks
*	□ 85% but < 89%	3 Marks
*	□ 90% but < 94%	4 Marks
*	□ 95% onwards	5 Marks
 - (c) **Mid-Term Tests**: There will be one mid-term test of 15 marks.
 - (d) **Seminar/Assignment/Term Paper**: The remaining 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of seminar/assignment/term paper etc.
 - (ii) **End-Semester Examination (ESE) Annual Examination**: The remaining 70% for arts and 50% theory and 20% Practical for science and Geography of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of an end-semester examination (ESE) Annual Exam. that will be for three hours duration and will be covering the whole syllabus of the course.

Note : Admission will be strictly on merit and roster basis.

Note: The disability of physically Challenged will be as prescribed by the Govt. of Himachal Pradesh i.e. 40% or more.

7. FUNDS/FINE

- Every students must pay his/her dues on the dates notified from time to time.
 - A student will have to pay dues for 1st Year at the time of admission and in the month of October/November.
 - Failure to pay dues on due date will entail a fine of Rs. 10/ per day.
 - In case of non-payment of dues in advance, the name of the student will be struck off from the college rolls at the end of that month.
 - Registration fee will not be charged from the student migrating from another college if he/she is already registered with HP University. Other dues will be charged according as per rules.
- The name of a student will be struck off from the rolls of college if he/she remains absent without leave continuously for ten days in any class/subject. (Theory/Practical)
- In case the name of a candidate is struck off, the re-admission is permissible within first 10 days with a first readmission fee of Rs. 100/- on a prescribed proforma. If a candidate fails to seek re-admission within first 15 days then he/she should seek re-admission upto 20 days, on payment of Rs. 200/- as second re-admission fee on the personal presence of parent/guardian. After 20 days from the date his/her name is struck off there shall be no re-admission in any case.
- Every student will have to procure No Dues Certificate from the Library, NSS, NCC, Sports, College Canteen, Fee Clerk etc., if he/she wants to leave the college.
- The Principal can expel a student from the College if he/she is found guilty of misconduct/indiscipline/ragging.

6. The security deposit will lapse if a student does not apply for refund of security within one year of leaving the college.
7. The fine for absence has to be paid with dues, while fine imposed otherwise have to be deposited by the date announced, in the college office/fee counter.
8. Contribution towards PTA funds Rs. 400/- per student.
9. No tuition fee is charged from the Bona-fide Himachali girl students, subject to production of H.P. Bona-fide Certificate at the time of admission.
10. Students having more than 40% disability are exempted from tuition fee.

9. SCHOLARSHIPS:

The College offers various scholarships to the students regulated by the rules available in the college office. Application for these scholarships should be submitted in the college office, after the recommendation of the concerned teacher along with copy of Aadhar Card and photocopy of the Bank a/c Passbook with IFSC code. The College offers following scholarships:

2. Govt. of India Scholarship for the Handicapped Students
3. Poverty-Cum-Merit Scholarship
4. IRDP Scholarship Scheme

9.1. Leave Rules:

(a) General Leave Rules:-

1. Students can proceed on leave with prior permission. For this, they should fill in the leave form.
2. Leave upto 6 days is to be recommended by concerned course teachers and sanctioned by Head of Dept. of major subject of the student. For more duration i.e upto 10 days, a student must get application signed by the Principal.
3. Leave during House Examination/Class Test will be sanctioned only by the Principal on recommendation of the Head of Department.
4. Leave for sickness must be accompanied by a medical certificate

(b) Duty Leave Rules:

Participation by the students in Sports/Cultural/NSS/NCC/Co-Curricular activities, Inter-College/University Competitions shall be considered as duty leave for the period of respective competition (s); Duty leave, however, shall only be allowed if recommended by the concerned activity incharges, prior proceeding to the event.

10. MID TERM TEST AND LECTURE ATTENDANCE

All the students have to appear in the Mid Term test (MTT) which will be conducted in the month of September. Every student has to appear MTT and secure at least 45% marks in each subject or 45% marks in aggregate, failing which he/she shall be debarred from appearing in University Examination. Moreover a student who fails to show satisfactory result in MTT shall forfeit his/her claims to fee concession or other financial assistance. The students are required to be punctual and regular in their classes. According to the University rules every student must attend 75% lectures both in Theory & Practical Separately. The Principal can condone the actual participated days in every course including practicals in respect of students who have missed the classes on account of their participation on NSS/NCC/Sports/Cultural/Academic Activities.

11. Library:

The College Library is having 15,000 books in various subjects, magazines, leading dailies; Book Bank gives the facility to poor and helpless students to get the text books.

Rules:

1. Two books will be issued on the identity card for 15 days.
2. Reference books are not issued.
3. Delay in return of book on due date, a fine of Rs. 1/- per book per day will be charged.
4. If a book is mutilated or defaced by the student, the cost of book will have to be deposited along with fine.
5. In case of loss of a book, the student will have to pay present cost of book along with fine.

12. CO-CURRICULAR & EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

- 12.1 **Sports:** The College provides facilities to sports person and the teams prepared for university championship are:
Athletics, Basketball, Boxing, Chess, Cricket, Wrestling, Weight Lifting, Volleyball, Badminton etc.
- 12.2 **Cultural :** The students find an opportunity to take part in HPU Youth Festival Gp-I, II, III & IV on the basis of the talent they excel during the college cultural activities viz- Debate, Declamation, Quiz, Painting, Poster making, College Rangoli, Music (V&I), Dance, Drama, Skit & mime.
- 12.3 **N.S.S.:** In order to develop leadership quality, Communal harmony along with labour Culbing one unit of NSS is active with the motto “Not me Buy you. The enrollment is done on the basis of selection. The students learn to Serve, Sacrifice and Discipline, in their lives through one day & seven days camps.
- 12.4 **Rover and Rangers:** The College runs units of R & R in which 24 Rovers (Boys) & 24 Rangers (Girls) are members of one unit. It is playing an important role in the lives of young students as they get awareness about social, communal and National problems of Society.
- 12.5 **CSCA:** College Students Central Association is elected as per the norms and directions of H. P. University and following the recommendation of Lyngdoh committee. The body helps the college administration in the smooth functioning of its activities.
- 12.6 **College Magazine: - “Guler Gaurav”:** To bring out the creative talent of the students, the college magazine is published every year. The Magazine is having six sections; each section after receiving articles is edited by a staff member and assisted by student editor.
- 12.7 **Educational Tour:** The Educational Tours are arranged during winter vacations by the concerned committee to visit scientific, Historical, Industrial places to gather knowledge.

The college provides financial support as permitted under rules. The students have to produce written permission from their parents to accompany the tour.

- 12.8 **Career Guidance, Counseling & Placement Cell:** For the guidance of the students of the college, this cell has been constituted. Their counseling and placement in different fields is monitored by this cell for the bright future.
- 12.9 **Tutorial Management Cells:** Tutorials are constituted of each subject. The concerned Teachers of concerned Subjects will be tutors. The Head of Department will act as senior tutors & the Principal will be Tutor-in-Chief of the tutorial management cell.
- 12.10. **Red Ribbon Club:** The college has Red Ribbon Club which aware students against dreaded disease like HIV & AIDS through various programmes & competitions. This club also organise blood donation camps to encourage students donate blood for the sake of humanity under the **motto donate blood save life.**

13. ANNUAL PRIZE DISTRIBUTION FUNCTION:

The college organises Annual Prize Distribution Function in the month of March for awarding/presenting prizes to the students excelling in academic, sports, cultural, NSS and other co-curricular activities as follows:

4. Annual Sports competition of college: Best Athlete (Boy/Girl) I, II & III position in each event.

13.3 Cultural Prizes:

1. Commendable/Highly commendable position in H.P.U. Youth festival for single.
2. If team gets commendable/Highly commendable then each member of the team.
3. I, II & III position in different items in Annual Cultural Function of the college.

13.4 Other Prizes:

1. President, Vice President, Secretary & Joint Secretary of CSCA.
2. Students editors of 'Guler Gaurav' Magazine.
3. Best volunteers/performers and Office Bearers of NSS & Bharat Scout & Guide.
4. NSS Volunteer participated in Republic Day Parade.

14. CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

The Principal can impose fine, suspension or even rustication on any student who is found indulging in such misconduct as is listed below. Indiscipline in the campus will not be tolerated.

1. (a) Any act of ragging in the campus will be severely dealt with. Ragging implies harassment/physical or mental torture to another student by a student or a group of students. Any student found associated in such unlawful activities will be guilty of gross misconduct. Remember, ragging is a cognizable offence.
 (b) Any body found guilty of writing obscene language on blackboards, walls or furniture.
 (c) Aimlessly loitering in the Verandah, raising noise or attempts to disturb classes.
 (d) Smoking or taking drugs/alcohol etc. in the campus.
 (e) Any attempt to damage the furniture or other property in the campus.
 (f) Bringing unwanted outside persons to the campus or sitting unnecessary in the canteen or within the campus.
 (g) Playing in the stadium without the permission of the Principal.
 (h) Pasting posters on the walls or on the Notice Board without Principal's permission.
2. Students who participate in sports or extracurricular activities/educational tour must produce written permission from their parents/guardians.
3. Every student must always carry with him/her Identity Card which is issued to him/her at the time of admission. He/She must produce the Identity card whenever demanded by any teacher or the Principal.
4. Parents/Guardians are requested to remain in touch with the Principal and the concerned teachers regarding the progress of their wards in the college.
